Administrative/Biographical History

K. (Kenneth) Brad Ott is an activist and sociological researcher. Ott wrote, edited, and published the grassroots publications *Dialogue Newsjournal*, (1981-1998) and *Café Progresso Magazine*, (1997-2001) among others. These publications covered community activism and activities in New Orleans, Louisiana. Additionally, Ott co-founded and was a member of numerous community service groups, committees, and collectives. Ott has been recognized for these contributions and has been awarded community leader, social justice, and academic writing honors.

Scope and Content

The K. (Kenneth) Brad Ott Papers consist of materials chronicling the production and distribution of Ott's self-published social justice and activism publications. The bulk of this collection is related to the publication, production, distribution, promotion, and corresponding networking congregated around Ott's publishing activities. The remaining contents of the collection consist of other publications, ephemera, and correspondence congregated by Ott during his publishing years.

System of Arrangement

The collection is divided into four series, K. Brad Ott Publications, Correspondence, Other Publications and Organizations, and Collected Publications. Within each series the arrangement scheme is chronological.

Conditions Governing Access

The collection is open for research use.

Conditions Governing Reproduction and Use

Physical rights are retained by the J. Edgar and Louis S. Monroe Library, Loyola University New Orleans. Copyright is retained in accordance with U.S. Copyright Laws.

Ott's publication materials were produced between 1981-2000 and include the self-published periodicals *Dialogue*, *Alternative Hotline Bulletin*, *Reproductive Freedom Defense Frontline Bulletin*, and *Café Progresso*. Bookkeeping records outlining the funding and cost of production, pre-print paste-ups of various issues, and an assortment of event fliers are also included.

Series II: Correspondence

Series II includes general correspondence and prisoner correspondence files. The general correspondence files were collected between 1984-1997, and consist of personal messages and subscription-related correspondence from activists, advocates, artists, and other underground/grassroots publishers. These files contain numerous types of ephemera such as postcards, photographs, pamphlets, and fliers. Some notable correspondents include activist Greg Boertje, artist Peter Küstermann, poet Lee Meitzen Grue, historian Dr. Lance Hill, and activist/organizer Gary Modenbach.

The prisoner correspondence files were collected between 1985-1998, and consist of communication between Ott and inmates incarcerated in the United States. These files contain letters, pamphlets and other material associated with subscription requests, as well as various actions and campaigns for prisoner rights and release. Some noteworthy correspondence includes information regarding Arnold (Avi) Naftel's and Linda Evans' incarcerations. The bulk of these files consist of letters from Albert "Chui" Clark and Reginald W. Myer regarding an action called the Campaign For Exposure. This action sought to expose corruption and oppression in the Louisiana State Penitentiary in Angola, La.

Series III: Other Publications and Organizations

Series III consists of items related to other community groups Ott either co-founded or participated in. Materials include publications produced by these groups, organizational information, and fliers. The organizations include Delta Greens, ECO Newsletter of Environmental Conservation, Environmental Forum, Freeport Watch Review, and New Orleans Social Ecology Group.

Series IV: Collected Publications I. Oversized Collected Publications

Series IV consists of an assortment of publications collected by Ott between the years 1975-1995. These are self-published grassroots activism and underground press publications primarily produced in the southern United States. Most notably of these is an almost complete run of *Broken Barriers* (1975-1980), an underground press newspaper published in New Orleans, Louisiana.
